How to encourage our students to be

INQUIRERS

How can parents help to develop students who are inquirers at home?

Parents can help foster inquirers at home in a variety of ways:

- ⇒ Ask your child what they are learning in their classes. Have a discussion where you allow your child to express their questions.
- * Encourage areas of your child's interest by visiting the library to borrow book or taking your child to a book store to purchase books in order to explore these topics in depth.
- * Model being an inquirer. In fact, admit when you do not know the answer to a problem or question and seek out the answers (in front of your child). Once you have found the answer, have a discussion with your child.
- ★ Encourage your child to read newspapers and magazines to stay informed
 of current events. When questions arise, encourage your child to further
 research and discuss findings.
- ★ Take your child to the museums and other places that stimulate inquiries. Have your child formulate questions on topics or exhibits that catch his/her attention.
- ☆ When you catch your child being an inquirer, express your approval and provide encouragement so that your child can continue being an inquirer.
