Research

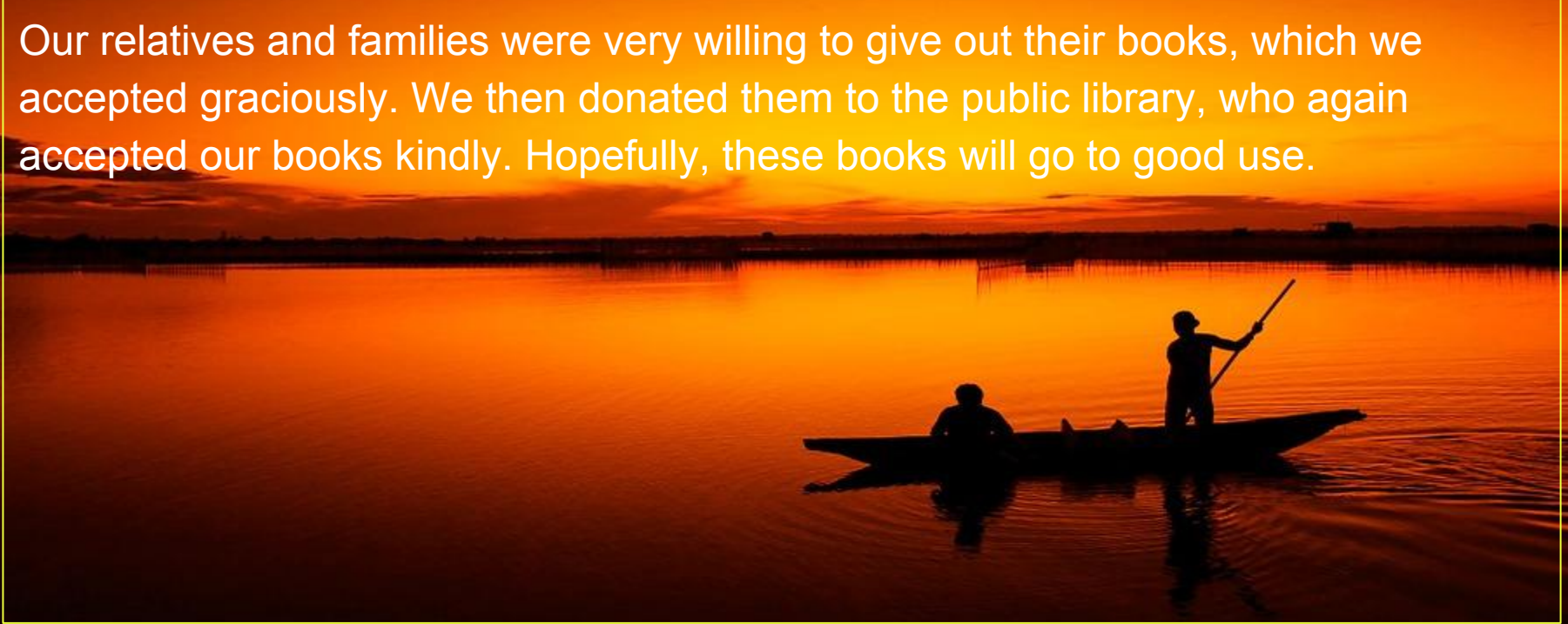
